a) The first contact with the congregation makes a link and encounter to a vocational animator who determines the come and see experiences with a duration not superior 1 month and not inferior 7 days.

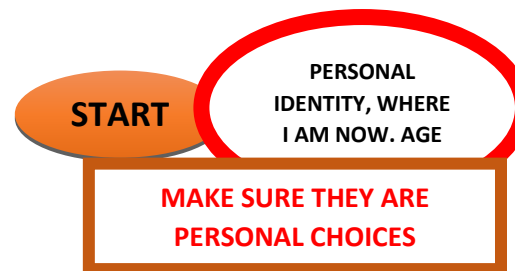
b) These experiences enables a potential analysis of initial and personal assessment of self-
